## 1903-08 Issue - Five Cents

On January 20, 1903, the BEP issued the new five cents Lincoln design in blue as part of the definitive issue begun in 1902. The stamps bear the double lined "USPS" watermark.

On February 24, 1908, the stamp was issued as an endwise coil, perforated horizontally. The 1908 coils were the first issued by the government. There are no recorded examples of this stamp used on cover.

On May 30, 1908, the stamp was issued imperforate. Only 13,200 were issued imperforate and most of these went to manufacturers of private vending machine coils.

In 1904, Canal Zone became under the jurisdiction of the United States and the P.O.D. overprinted stamps "Canal Zone" for use at nine post offices opened in connection with the construction of the Panama Canal.

On January 4, 1904, the P.O.D. issued the $5 \nless 1903$ value overprinted "Philippines" for use under American Administration of the islands.

Of the 13,200 total printing of the imperforates, it is believed that 10,000 were sent to New York City for use by U.S. Automatic Vending Company, 2,000 were sent to Indianapolis for use by Parkhurst Company and the remaining 1,200 were sent to Baltimore for use by International Vending Machine Company. Some of the sheets, likely from the stock sent to New York City, were used by Schermack Mailing Machine Company. No examples are known from International. Three types are reported from Shermack as well as U.S. Automatic Vending. Although Shermack Type I is listed, there are no certified examples and it may not exist genuine.
