RURAL FREE DELIVERY & THE DOANES.

In December of 1899 the P.O. Department issued a new type of postmark as illustrated above. The numeral in the PM denotes the rural route it was carried on. The test was from 1900 to July 1903. The postal card is a fine example of the first year of this test postmarked at R.F.D./LISCOMBE OCT 29 1900. A postal GEM.



IN 1903 the P.O. Dept. altered the R.F.D. Postmark with a circular type as illustrated by the cover above, DUELM MINN OCT 21 2pm 1907, bearing the numeral 4 in 4 bars, tying the Pocahontas stamps of the 1907 issue. A registered cover bearing a handstamped figure of a dogs head with a tag on its collar R.E.G. No 23. SEE U.S. DOANES by Helbock & Anderson page 6.
