SALARIES OF POSTMASTERS.

N all offices of less than \$1,000 salaries, the box-rent is all retained by the postmaster. See Section 117 of the Postal Laws and Regulations. And all postmasters, except of the *first-class*, are directly benefited by increasing their box-rents.

In many offices the rules of the department are violated, by neglecting to collect rent for boxes, and allowing the box-holder to have the use of the box free; it is also customary, in many places, to put the mail for whole neighborhoods in one box. Where this has been practiced, it is impossible to rent boxes. Congress has passed laws to regulate it; but it is very difficult to make any change where the boxes have been used for a long time, and a great many postmasters have found that by far the easiest way to do it was to throw the old boxes away, and put in new ones.

To assist postmasters in this, and make it more easy to make such change, I have had printed a neat placard, giving Sections 300, 301 and 302 of Postal Laws and Regulations, which are as follows:

Section 300.—Rent of boxes to be prepaid.—No box at any post-office shall be assigned to the use of any person, until the rent thereof has been paid for, at least one quarter in advance, for which the postmaster shall give a receipt. (R. S., § 3901.)

Section 301.—Payment for boxes must be quarterly.—Postmasters must rent the boxes and drawers in their post-offices, for one quarter (three months) only, the money to be paid in advance. The department will insist upon a strict compliance with this regulation. Boxes remaining unpaid for ten days from the expiration of a quarter will be declared vacated.

Section 302.—Box to be restricted to use of one family.—A person renting a post-office box is entitled to have the letters of his family put into it. Each box must be restricted to the use of one family, firm or corporation.

These rules will be furnished to any of my customers, and will be found very useful in calling the attention of the public to the matter of renting boxes. The Government pays postmasters large salaries, and expects them to furnish their patrons with some conveniences, and the public very quickly and gratefully notice anything that is done by the postmaster for them. There is no way in which this can be accomplished better than by putting in an outfit of the wire-bottom post-office boxes.

"NEW MODEL" POST-OFFICE CABINETS.

Y "New Model" Cabinets are designd to meet the wants of those progressive postmasters who desire the most perfect post-office outfit ever offered for small offices. These designs are the result of long experience and a careful study of the requirements of fourth-class offices, and they are now shown with great confidence that they will sustain the high reputation that my Post-Office cabinets have always held in the public estimation.

I wish to call your especial attention to a few facts about these cabinets: 1st. That the workmanship on them is good. 2d. The material used for the boxes is whitewood, smoothly finished. 3d. The sash, delivery wicket, panelwork, and cornice are solid pearl Ash, and highly finished. Work made of these materials has a much handsomer appearance than can be obtained by using the cheaper grades of lumber.

DESCRIPTION OF THE "NEW MODEL" CABINETS.

CALL BOXES are all made with my patent Wire Bottoms, which are conceded to be the best post-office box ever made.

GENERAL-DELIVERY BOXES for letters and papers are placed in all of these cabinets. They are situated on each side of the delivery wicket, and covered with pearl Ash panels (as shown in the cuts). Those on the right are for letters, and those on the left are for papers; and each box is properly lettered.

EXTRA BOXES.—Over the delivery wicket there are some extra boxes, which are very convenient for envelopes, postal cards, etc.

CASH AND STAMP DRAWER.—Each cabinet is supplied with a drawer suitably divided for cash and stamps, secured by a Sargent & Greenleaf lock, and fitted with sliding coin cups.

DELIVERY WICKET.—Each cabinet is provided with a delivery wicket made of solid pearl Ash, double doors, a large, handsome shelf, and brass guards.




On the opposite page is shown an illustration of my No. 2 Style of an office, and is adapted to rooms from 16 to 30 feet in width.

The general-delivery window is in front; over it is the sign, in solid bronze, "General Delivery," and underneath the shelf, on the inside, is provided a case of drawers, suitably divided for stamps, cash, etc. Each drawer is secured by a Sargent & Greenleaf patent spring lock, with two keys. Each side of the window are the alphabetical cases, glazed, with obscure glass and the device "Postal Seal." Back of the cases on each side are 200 call-boxes, with a delivery wicket in the center; and farther back on each side are nests of 64 lock-boxes each, and at the right is the money-order window and counter for the transaction of money-order and registered-letter business, appropriately ornamented with obscure glass and blue monograms. Underneath the shelf is a cupboard. At the left is the postmaster's door, with a solid bronze plate over it.

I also provide an extra shelf underneath the counter-top for matter that accumulates in an office. When this outfit is set in position it is complete, ready for the transaction of business.

I construct my joiner-work in solid ash, of Queen Anne style, and finely finished.








