CALL BOXES.
M. . We make this line of cases uniformly 8 boxes high, giving a total height of 3 feet 8 inches to top of cornice. Store Counters are usually 2 feet 6 inches high, giving the height to the top of the upper boxes in the P. O. Case, about 5 feet io inches-never over 6 feet.

Are made with wire bottoms, this arrangement for a dustless box being recognized as standard and beyond the bane of "Patent."

WOODS.

GENERAL DELIVERY.

Are selected White Ash, for case work, including sashes, and best grade Whitewood for partitions between boxes and inside work. Stock selected and kiln-dried.

We make a uniform size for all Counter Cabinets, consisting of 24 boxes for letters, at right of delivery wicket (inside), and 16 boxes for papers at the left. Proper alphabet supplied for each section. Extra Boxes are located above the wicket opening, for postal card stock, envelopes, etc.
. . . CASH DRAWER, secured with Spring Lock (flat key), fitted for stamps and currency, and having a sliding coin tray.

Material. The Cornice, Counters, Sashes, General Delivery, Doors, etc., are manufactured from selected White Ash (unless otherwise agreed). This stock is thoroughly air-dried and kiln-dried. Counters artistically paneled; Pilasters of graceful design ; Cornices modern ; the whole a handsome piece of Cabinet work. Boxes are constructed of Whitewood, well seasoned, smoothly finished.
Call Boxes. These are uniformly 3 inches wide, 5 and $3-16$ inches high, and 8 inches deep (special sizes made to order), and are constructed with brass wire bottoms, making a dustless box. Call Boxes are provided with name clifs and name Slips properly numbered without extra charge.

## CENTER CASES

THIS Style of Case is recognized as the most approved for offices of the larger size, and we recommend strongly wherever an office calls for 500 boxes or more, that this plan be adopted. E have distributed through the Catalogue complimentary letters, and generally they are given where this style of an office has been supplied. We have been particularly successful, and in fact, we make a special feature of this style of an o/fice, and we refer to the plans on page 29 as giving the two styles which are generally adopted. The letter of Hon. B. S. Ambler, Salem, O., which will be found on page 16, refers to one of these outfits (plan D), except that the "Public Lobby" for EMoney Order Department as shown in plan E was adopted.
AT Gainesville, Texas, where the outfit comprised about 500 Lock Boxes, the plan E was adopted with the exception that there were no Call Boxes. A detailed description of the Gainesville Case will be found on page 32 .
IN these Center Outfits, it is necessary always to consult the purchaser's ideas in the matter; have exact figures as to the dimensions of the room to be occupied and the proportion of Call and Lock Boxes needed; information as to whether the Money Order Department shall be separated from the public corridors, and all such details carefully given, so that we may present intelligent specification and estimate of cost.
THE descriptive matter on page 17 would apply to these cases, but in making proposition, we submit a sketched drawing and carefully prepared description of the Case as a part of the contract. On page 31 we give a general view of one of these outfits, and it will be noticed that our conformity to late styles in the matter of pilasters, cornice and counter work is very pleasing and modern.
A NOTHER very pleasing feature with these large cases and on which we cannot give facts in the Catalogue, is the matter of price. Do not fail to get our figures before purchasing elsewhere. If overhead work is desired, give height of ceiling as well as other proportions of the room.

Handsomely A ppointed-Perfect in Every Particular.

A New Year's Gift to the People.
When the news came here on the 27th of last March that Mr. W. L. Pierce had been appointed postmaster of Gainesville, we prophesied that he would give our people the very best service, and we said this because we knew Mr. Pierce and had observed his methods in business. Time has proved that we made no mistake in our high anticipations. Tomorrow the people of Gainesville will get their mail from an office that is not to be "turned down" in all the state of Texas. It is a gem.
The new office has been located in the handsome Auer building on the corner of Red River and California streets, which stands in the very center of the city. The building is a new brick, finished in the best of modern style inside and out. It is no easy thing to describe and do justice to the postoffine itself, The "case" and all the work is of solid white oak, manufactured by This. Kane \& Co., of Chicago. The glasswork is of the richest kind and represent natural frost as true to natyre a's it is possible for human ingenuity to make it.
the front are two general delivery windows, one for the ladies and one for the gentlemen, and these windows are cut off from the outside space by splendid Bessemer steel railings. There are 230 lock boxes on each, side of the build. ing, making a total of 460, numbering from 1 up to 460 ; also twenty-four lock drawers in bronze. Nickle plated keys go with these, and the locks are the latest invention and of the best quality. On each side of the building there are receptacles for mailed letters and papers. Overhead there is a wire screen of strong bronze wire, with finishing of oak. On the right of the main entrance there is a neat and cozy lady's office, with desk and chairs of antique oak. This is where ladies may drop in to write letters, portals and notes which they forgot to do before they left home-a convenience the ladies of Gainesville never enjoyed before, and for which they will be duly appreciafive, Mr. Pierce. On the opposite side of the building there is a marble slab desk for the use of the gentlensen. On the same side further back is the stamp departmont, and to the left of this the money order and registry departmont, set back to itself and cut off from the main corridor by heavy bevelled plate glass, frosted, with entrance through a heavy oak door with plate glass panel.

Pierce is 7 admirable work that has been done by every contractor connected with the job, and when wo understand that all has been done since Dec. 19th and no cause of complaint, it appears the more remarkable.

Gainesville should feel very proud of her new postoffice, and to those who have been instrumental in fitting it up a vote of thanks. might well be given.

*The sashes are of Ash, glazed with obscured glass, ornamented with seal of Post Office Department, or other appropriate device, which permits the light to pass, but prevents contents of boxes from being seen from the outside.


THE regular letter boxes are lettered on a new and improved system. Across the top are all the consonants and Y. Down the sides and center are the vowels. When the name on a letter (for instance Ridell) begins with a consonant, the letter goes in a column under R and opposite I. Should the name be Morgan it goes in the column under M -opposite O . If the name is Owens it goes in horizontal row of O and under W. The paper case is lettered on the same principle.

By this system all letters for same family will be found in same box and the alphabet is better subdivided so that the boxes will be more equally filled.

Under the letter boxes are provided 20 boxes for names pronounced the same but spelled differently-as Green, Greene and Grein, under G; Tyrell, Terrell and Terrill, under T. The O's also are placed in this row-O'Howard, for instance, under H. The Mac's should be placed under M opposite the first vowel in the last name.

The No. C cases are similar to the number B, differing only in number of boxes.
No. A letter case is lettered on a different system, as the "vowel system" cannot be used owing to the large number of boxes. It is 24 boxes wide and 12 boxes high, without boxes for advertised or miscellaneous letters. Across the top and center the alphabet is given, one letter to a box, and down the sides and middle two letters to a box. The paper case is same size as the letter case, but the boxes are wider and have two letters to a box across and down the case.

No. D is a Combined Letter and Paper Case, and consists of 100 boxes on top of case for letters, 20 wide and 5 high, the boxes for advertised and miscellaneous letters being omitted-and at bottom 50 larger boxes, 10 wide and 5 high, for papers. The lettering is same as on the B case, except that the lettering of paper case is two to a box across strip.

The boxes in all the Letter cases have wire bottoms, and the Paper cases, solid bottoms.
