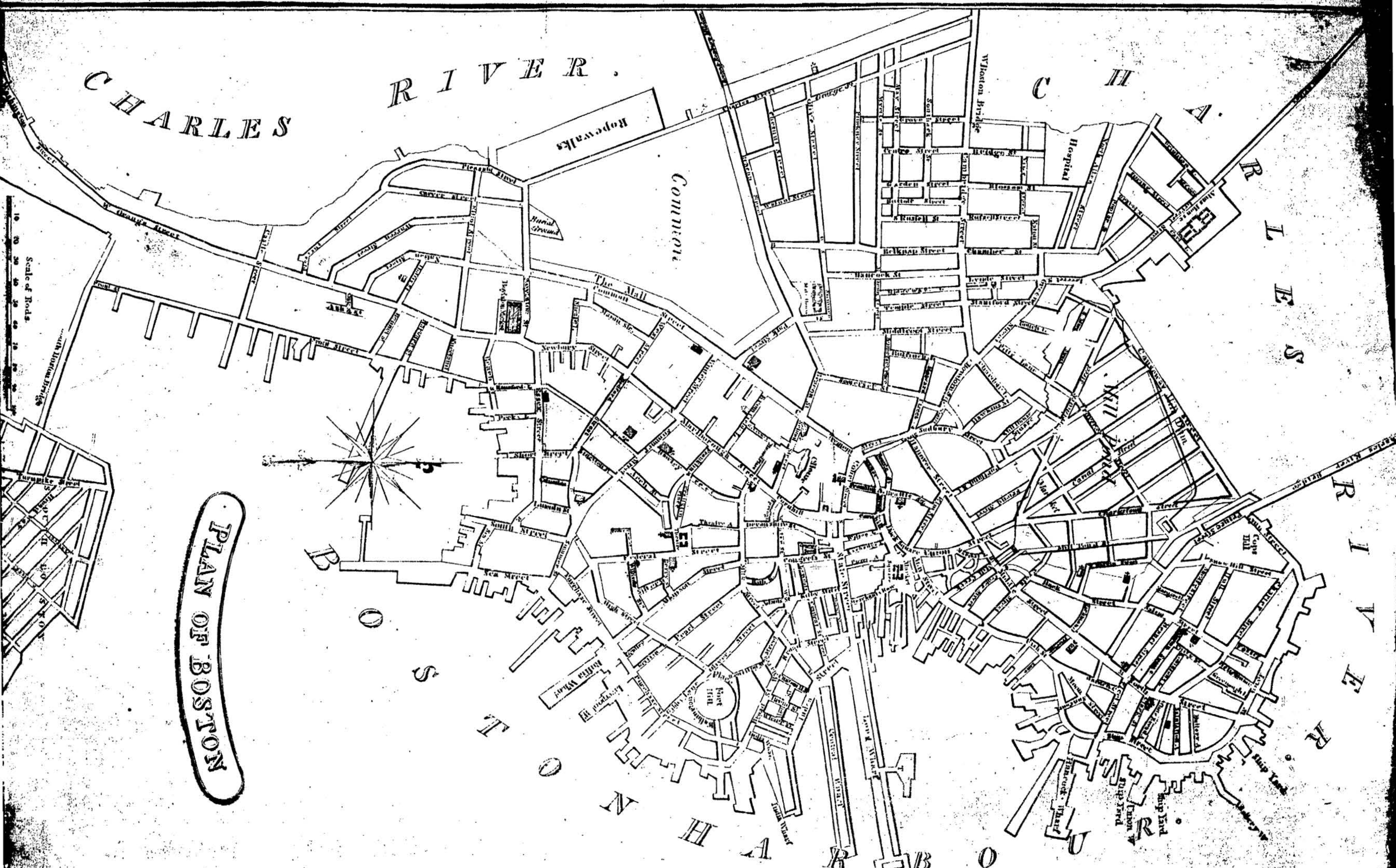

ADVERTISEMENT.

THE Directory of the present year has been compiled with great care and expense, and contains thirty-six pages more than the last. The alterations are numerous, more so perhaps than the public are, or can be, aware of; this confirms the publishers in the opinion that it is expedient and necessary to continue it yearly.

The necessity of giving specific directions to persons who reside in streets where the buildings are not numbered, is obvious to every one who has had occasion to seek a person so situated; and the difficulty is more to be regretted, when it is considered, that for a trifling individual expense numbers might be attached to every building, and the community relieved from a vexatious and troublesome embarrassment to which they are daily subjected. Some of our principal streets are but partially numbered, and those very irregularly. This inconvenience might be easily remedied by the exertions of two or more active individuals in each street. The common apology, that the lots are not all occupied, and therefore the numbers would become irregular and useless, is obviated by the fact, established by experience, that a building which is numbered, whether regularly or irregularly, is, on recurrence to the street, present to the recollection of most people who have viewed it before; and thus the necessity of going from one end of the street to the other in pursuit of a person, is avoided, by being enabled to go direct to the place.

WARDS,

As divided and established by the Committee chosen for that purpose, June 17, 1805.

No. 1.—From the northerly side of the east end of Charles river bridge, the north side of Prince street, to Middle street; the west side of Middle street to low water mark at Winnesimit ferry; thence westerly and southerly, to the low water mark at the north side of Charles river bridge.

No. 2.—From Winnesimit ferry, east side of North street and part of Middle street to Proctor lane; north side of Proctor lane to the Town slip; thence to low water mark, turning northerly and westerly by the low water mark to Winnesimit ferry.

No. 3.—From the south side of the east end of Charles river bridge, the south side of Prince street to Middle street, west side of Middle street to Proctor lane; south side of Proctor lane to the Town slip; thence to low water, and southerly by low water mark to a line in the direction of the Mill-creek; said creek to the causeway, being the southern boundary.

No. 4.—From the south side of the Mill-creek, the east side of Hanover street to Concert Hall; the north side of Court street, including the north side of Pemberton hill; the north side of State street and the Long wharf; thence northerly including Brimmer's T, to the Mill-creek.

No. 5.—From the Mill-creek, the west side of Hanover street to Howard street; the north side of Howard street to Bulfinch street; the east side of Bulfinch st. to Bowdoin square; the north side of Bowdoin square and Cambridge street to Lynde street; the east side of Lynde and Leveret streets to the causeway; and that part of the Mill-pond south of the Mill creek to the causeway.

No. 6.—From the causeway, the west side of Leveret street, of Lynde and Hancock streets to Myrtle st.; the North side of Myrtle street to South Russell street; the east side of South Russell street to May street; the north side of May street to the water, thence northerly and easterly, following the low water mark to the causeway.

No. 7.—From the west end of May street, the south side of May street to South Russell street; the west side of South Russell street to Myrtle street; the south side of Myrtle street to Hancock street; the east side of Hancock street to Cambridge street; the south side of Cambridge street through Bowdoin square to Bulfinch street; the west side of Bulfinch street to Howard street; the south side of Howard street to Tremont st.; the west side of Tremont street to Park street and Beacon street; the north side of Beacon street to the water, thence northerly by low water mark to the west end of May street.
