P R E F A C E.

THE first and last Directory of LANCASTER was published by JAMES H. BRYSON, Printer, in 1843, and contained about *one thousand names*. The present volume contains *four thousand*, exclusive of the Business Directory, Appendix, &c.

In a publication of this order, allowing no scope for the play of the imagination, being a simple exponent of facts wherein every person represented becomes an interested critic, its every error, however slight, is immediately detected; and it is hoped in passing judgment upon the work the reader will place to the credit of the Publisher the many difficulties that necessarily present themselves during compilation. Careful and experienced men have canvassed the city, and it is believed that every name which ought to be in the Directory will be found within its pages.

In order to *find* a name, it is *absolutely* necessary to know how that name is spelled.

I beg to acknowledge the courtesy which has been extended by the Press generally, and the kindness of Messrs. Sprenger & Westhaeffer (who had in contemplation the publication of the work), in waving their interest to me; and to thank the citizens generally for their urbanity, patience, and liberality.

It was my intention to have furnished an Historical Sketch of the city, &c.; but it not coming to hand in due season (the time of promising the book having already passed), I am reluctantly obliged to postpone it till my next publication, when I shall appear before you as a friend already known.

The CONGRESS of the United States consists of a Senate and a House of Representatives, and must assemble at least once a year—on the first Monday of December, unless otherwise directed by law.

The SENATE is composed of two members from each State; so that the regular number is now sixty-two. They are chosen by the Legislatures of the several States for the term of six years, one third being elected biennially. The Vice-President of the United States is President of the Senate, having the casting vote when the votes of the Senators are equally divided. In case of his absence or death, a President *pro tempore* is chosen by the Senators from their own body.

The HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES is composed of members from the several States, elected by the people for the term of two years, and apportioned to the population in the following manner:—After each decennial census, the Secretary of the Interior is to add to the whole number of free persons—including those bound to service for a term of years, and excluding Indians not taxed—three fifths of all other persons. This aggregate is to be divided by 233, and the quotient, rejecting fractions, is to be the ratio of apportionment to the several States. The representative population of each State, ascertained in the same manner, and divided by the above-named ratio, will give a quotient which is the apportionment for that State. Any loss by fractions is to be made up by assigning to as many States, hav-

ing the largest fractions, as may be necessary to make the whole number of representatives 233, one additional member each. And if, after the apportionment, new States are admitted, representatives are assigned to such States on the above basis in addition to the limited number of 233; but such excess is to continue only till the next apportionment under the succeeding census. The present number of representatives under this law is 234; and there are, besides, seven delegates,—one each from Oregon, Minnesota, Utah, New Mexico, Washington, Kansas, and Nebraska, who have a right to speak, but not to vote.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS, &c.

COURT HOUSE situated in East King street, corner of Duke, is a splendid structure substantially built of brown stone, and is a credit to the city and county of Lancaster. It contains on the lower floor the several offices attached to the county, and in the upper floor the court rooms.

COUNTY PRISON, East King street, above Ann, is also built of brown stone in the old-

fashioned castle style; there is considerable work of different kinds done in the prison by the convicts, and is a source of no small amount of revenue to the county. The officers are as follows:—

MASONIC HALL, over the old Market House, West King street, entrance in Market square. This hall was one of the original borough buildings erected in the 18th century, and was granted to the Order for ever, or as long (the grant reads) as they, the Masons, shall keep the roof of the building in good order. The lodge-room was, until very recently, rather unassuming in its appearance; but by the enterprise and liberality of the Fraternity, has been entirely remodeled and beautifully ornamented and furnished, and now ranks second only, in the State, to the "Grand Lodge" room at Philadelphia, and reflects great credit upon the Order.

Lodge No. 43, R. A. Chapter No. 43, Columbia Encampment No. , numbering some 200 members, all meet in the above Hall.

His Excellency the Hon. James Buchanan, President of the United States, is one of the P. Ms. of Lodge No. 43.

ODD FELLOWS' HALL, South Queen street, near Vine, is a fine large building purchased and altered in 1836 by Lancaster Lodge No. 67, for the use of and dedicated to the Order in 1850; it contains several rooms for the meetings of the different Lodges, as follows: Lancaster Lodge No. 67, Monterey Lodge No. 242, Fulton Lodge No. 454, Washington Encampment No. 11. The Order is in a very prosperous and flourishing condition. G. T. Zahm, *Janitor*.

ing congregations, came to Lancaster, 1731. The stone church taken down in 1852, was built in 1753. The present church was commenced 1852. The pastors successively were—Rev. John Jacob Hock, 1736—1737. Vacant till 1739. Name of the pastor unknown from 1739 to 1742. Rev. Casper Lewis Schuerr, 1744—1746. Visited and supplied occasionally by Rev. Michael Scheatter from 1746—1749. Rev. Ludwig Ferdinand Vock, 1750—1751. Rev. Philip William Otterbein, 1752—1758. Rev. Dr. William Stoy, 1758—1763. Rev. Dr. William Hendel, 1765—1769. Rev. Charles Lewis Roehm, 1771—1775. Rev. John C. A. Helfenstein, 1776—1779. Rev. John Theobald Faber, 1779—1782. Rev. Dr. William Hendel, second term, 1782—1794. Rev. Dr. Charles Lewis Becker, 1795—1806. Rev. John Henry Hoffmeier, 1806—1832. Rev. Martin Brunner, 1832—1839. Rev. George W. Glissner, 1840—1847. Rev. N. A. Keyes, 1847—1850. Rev. D. Y. Heisler was German minister during a part of this term. Rev. H. Harbaugh, 1850, up to this date. The organ was made in 1769 by David Tannenberg, of Litiz. The bells were cast for the church, in London, 1784. The Sabbath School was organized in 1832. The congregation is governed by a Corporation and Consistory of sixteen men—one minister, six elders, six deacons, and three trustees. Members, 575.

The "Woodward Hill Cemetery" is romantically situated on the western bank of the river Conestoga, on the south side of the city of Lancaster. The grounds are high and gently undulating, having a fine view of the city, the graceful curves of the winding river, for a considerable distance, and an extensive prospect over a highly cultivated country, interspersed with hill and forest, presenting almost every variety of interesting scenery.

The soil is gravel clay, free from moisture and well adapted to burial purposes. The cemetery plot embraces about 15 acres, divided into 1,600 Burial Lots intersected with broad avenues and foot ways, macadamized in the most substantial manner, filled with a variety of evergreen, shade, and forest trees. The natural beauty of the location, its peculiar situation, the many improvements which have been made, and others contemplated, and of which it is susceptible, will in a short time render it one of the most appropriate and beautiful cemeteries in the country.

By the Charter granted in 1851, the grounds are protected from invasion for any purpose. The principal entrance is through a wide lawn divided by a broad avenue of gentle ascent, running from South Queen street, planted with evergreen and ornamental trees. The residence of the Superintendent is on the Cemetery grounds. A modern Receiving Vault of

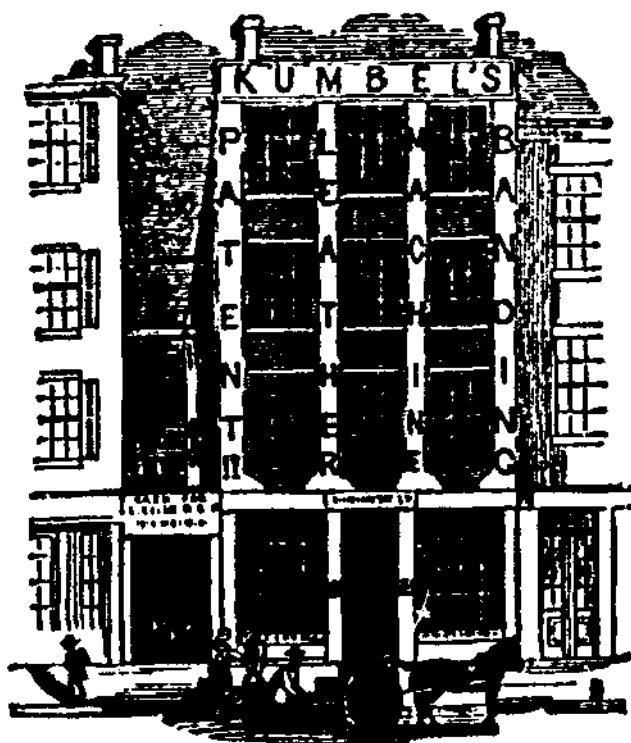
